## Exterior Inspection

### Structural Integrity

- No signs of water damage or delamination on the walls
- Roof is in good condition, no sagging or soft spots
- Window seals are intact, no cracks or leaks
- Slide-outs operate smoothly and seal properly

### Tires and Wheels

- Tires are not cracked, have good tread, and are properly inflated
- Wheels are free of rust and damage
- Spare tire is in good condition

### Utility Connections

- Electrical plug and cord are in good condition
- Water and sewer connections are intact and functional
- Propane tank and connections show no signs of rust or damage

### Storage Compartments

- Doors and seals are in good condition
- No signs of water or rodent intrusion

# Interior Inspection

## General Condition

- No musty or moldy odors
- Flooring is in good condition, no soft spots
- Walls and ceiling show no signs of water damage

## Kitchen Area

- Stove, oven, and microwave function properly
- Refrigerator and freezer cool adequately
- Sink and faucet work, no leaks

## Bathroom

- Toilet flushes and fills correctly
- Shower and sink have good water pressure and drain properly
- No signs of mold or mildew

## Living and Sleeping Areas

- Furniture is in good condition, no tears or stains
- Bed(s) are comfortable and free of damage
- Air conditioner and heater function properly

# Systems Check

## Electrical System

- All lights, inside and out, are functional
- Outlets work and are properly grounded
- Battery holds a charge

## Plumbing System

- No leaks in the water lines

- Water pump functions properly
- Water heater operates as expected

## HVAC System

- Air conditioning blows cold
- Heating system warms adequately
- Vents and filters are clean

## Safety Features

- Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are functional
- Fire extinguisher is present and not expired
- Emergency exits are accessible and functional
